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Внеклассное мероприятие по теме «Пасха»

Цель мероприятия: ознакомить учащихся с особенностями празднования Пасхи в англоговорящих странах, в частности в США и Великобритании, познакомить с основными пасхальными символами, характерными для этих стран, отметить сходства и различия празднования Пасхи в России и в англоговорящих странах.

Ход мероприятия:

Вводные слова, экспозиция:

You all know the holiday called Easter. It is a very old religious holiday. . Easter has no fixed date. It is held on the 1st Sunday after the date of the first full moon that occurs on or after March 21st. People in Great Britain and in the USA celebrate Easter a week earlier than people in Russia.

On Easter Sunday, Christians celebrate the resurrection of the Lord, Jesus Christ. Christians believe, according to Scripture, that Jesus came back to life, or was raised from the dead, three days after his death on the cross.

Easter lasts for a week. The three most important days are Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. On Maundy Thursday, the king or a queen of England gives money to poor people. The tradition is very old.

Easter has many symbols.

The most unusual for our country are hot cross buns. They are made of products people can eat during the Lent. There is a legend about them:

Once, long ago in England there lived a monk. In this town there were a lot of poor families. Very often they had nothing to eat. On Easter he baked many buns with raisins inside and decorated them with crosses. The cross has a special meaning to Christian. It represents Christ victory over death.

In Russia we also have special Easter pie- кулич.

Also children love easter bunny or rabbit very much. There is a very funny game, when children look for easter eggs which have been hidden by the rabbit. And then children get sweets.

The Easter Bunny is one of the most beloved symbols of Easter. Over centuries, the rabbit has always represented fertility and, thus, spring. In fact, the rabbit is often associated with the goddess, Ēostre (Истра-богиня весны и плодородия). And, it is from her name that the word "Easter" is thought to have evolved. It was, however, in Germany that the Easter Bunny was conceived. Joseph Grimm, of the infamous Brother's Grimm who collected and recorded such fairy tales as Little Red Riding Hood and Hansel and Gretel, wrote of the myth of the Easter Bunny in 1835, although mention of the Easter Bunny has been traced to German writing in the 1600's. Germany was also the birthplace of those delectable edible Easter bunnies we all love today. When Germans immigrated to Pennsylvania, they brought with them not only the edible bunnies but also the tale of Osterhase, a rabbit who would lay brightly colored eggs in "nests", created by children with their bonnets and caps, hidden in the home. But, only if the children had behaved themselves!

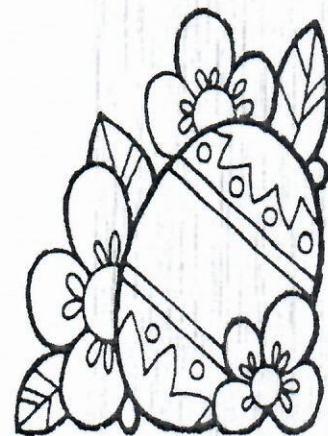

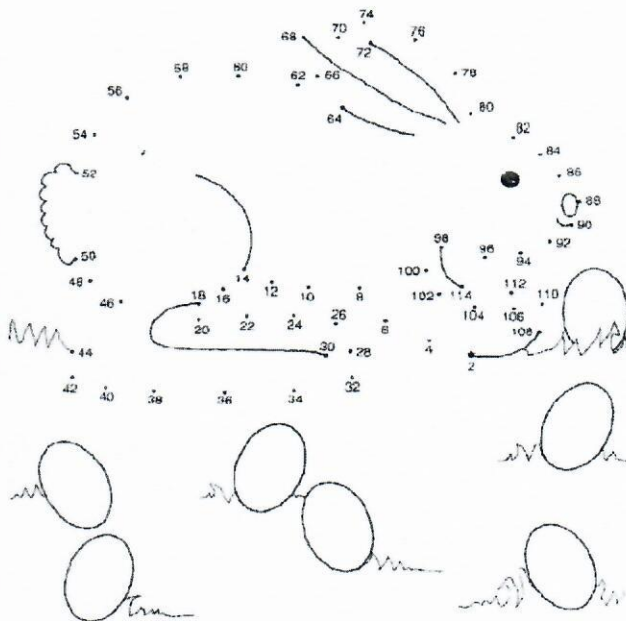

1. Easter eggs & baby chicks- Eggs and chicks symbolize new life. Eggs have been a symbol of spring since ancient times. An egg also is a symbol of the rock tomb out of which Christ emerged when he arose again. The chick, hatching out of the egg, symbolizes new life or re-birth.

2. Easter bunny- The rabbit, or hare, was a symbol of abundant new life in ancient times, and reminds us of spring and new life.

3. Easter Lilies- The white blossoms symbolize the purity of Jesus. Lilies, emerging from the earth in the spring, also symbolize new life and the resurrection of Christ.

4. The lamb - Represents Jesus, "the Lamb of God".

5. The cross - Symbolizes Jesus' victory over death.

6. Palm branches- Represent when Jesus arrived in Jerusalem on the first Palm Sunday and people waved palm branches, welcoming him.

7. Easter hats & wearing new clothes for Easter- Symbolizes new life offered through the death and resurrection of Jesus.

8. Hot Cross Buns- Hot cross buns have a cross of icing on the top to remind people of Christ.

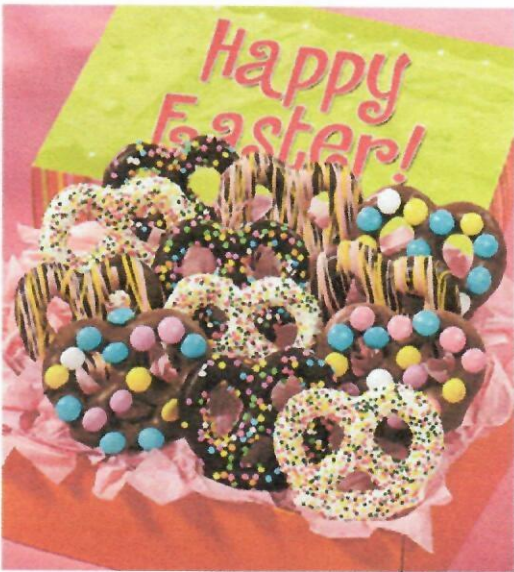
9. Candles - Symbolize Jesus, "the light of the world".

10. Pretzels - A food eaten during Lent- the twisted shaped symbolizes arms crossed in prayer.

11. Easter & Spring flowers- Daffodils and tulips bloom in the spring, and symbolize spring and new life.

12. Baby animals- Baby animals born in the spring also represent spring and new life.

13. The Butterfly is one of the significant symbols of Easter. Its whole life cycle is meant to symbolize the life of Jesus Christ. The first stage, is the caterpillar, which stands for His life on Earth. Second phase begins from the cocoon stage, portraying the crucifixion and burial of Jesus. The third and final stage is the butterfly, representing His raising from the dead in a glorified body and peace.





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
