

Внеклассное мероприятие для учащихся 7 класса.

Quiz "What do you know about the UK?"

Тема: «Travelling to the United Kingdom»

Цель: обобщение изученного материала по теме «The Geography of the UK and its Political Outlook»

Сопутствующая задача: формирование социокультурной компетенции; совершенствование лексико-грамматических навыков говорения, развитие умения воспринимать информацию на слух.

Познавательная задача: формирование у учащихся интереса к культуре народа страны изучаемого языка, расширение их кругозора.

Развивающая задача: развитие навыков разговорной речи с использованием пройденного материала.

Воспитательная задача: воспитание толерантного отношения к людям других национальностей

Оснащение: раздаточный материал, компьютер, интерактивная доска.

Место проведения: кабинет английского языка.

Ход мероприятия.

Good afternoon, boys and girls! I'm very glad to see you here. Today we have a quiz called "What do you know about the UK?". You're divided into three teams. The topic of our quiz is the UK. Do you know a lot about these countries? Today we will choose pupils who know these countries better than others do. To win this quiz you need to work with your classmates. You need to be a real team. Winners will get special prizes that you'll see in the end of our competition.

So listen to me, please. The rules of our quiz are following. The quiz consists of 6 rounds. The quiz will be on the interactive board. After each round every team will get points. For every question, you'll have about 15 seconds to think over the answer. When you are ready to give the answer, you are to rise this green square. There will be special rounds for captains. Therefore, the first thing you should do is to choose a captain. The score table is on the black board. All of you need to be very active to make this competition even more interesting.

So right now think of the name of your team and choose your captain.

Let's start!

I round. And the first round begins! This round is for the whole team. You'll see questions about the general information of the UK. You need to answer as quick as possible to get a point.

2. What are the main colours of the Union flag?

4. What is the famous airport in London?
5. Where were "The Beatles" born?
6. What is favourite hot drink in Britain
7. What is difference between English and Russian tea?
8. What is the seventh biggest city of the world situated in the UK?
9. What is the name of the current monarch?

10. When did the Great Fire of London take place?
11. What are the names of the most famous universities in Britain?
12. What component of the United Kingdom is the smallest?
13. When do English people celebrate Christmas?
14. What is the national costume of Scotland?
15. What is Loch Ness famous for?

II round This round is all about the geography of the UK. Now you'll have 15 seconds to think and you are to give the full answer. For example: What is the name of the UK flag? – The name of the UK flag is the Union Jack. Work with each other and let all members of your team participate.

2. What is between Great Britain and Ireland?
3. Where is the UK situated?
4. What is the UK washed by in the west?
5. What is the UK washed by in the east?
6. What are the largest islands of the British Isles?
7. What separates the UK from the continent?

10. What is the worst thing about the climate of the British Isles?

III round Well done! We move on to the next round. You are to answer the questions about the political system of the UK. Now your task is to choose the correct letter of the answer. You'll have 15 seconds to think. Let's begin!

6. One can say that the City is the money of London, the West End is the goods of London, and the East End is the hands of London

IV. Captains come back to your teams. Now you are to work as a team again. This is our final round. Your task is to decide if the character or famous person is English or American. The team that answers the first one gets a point. Good luck!
